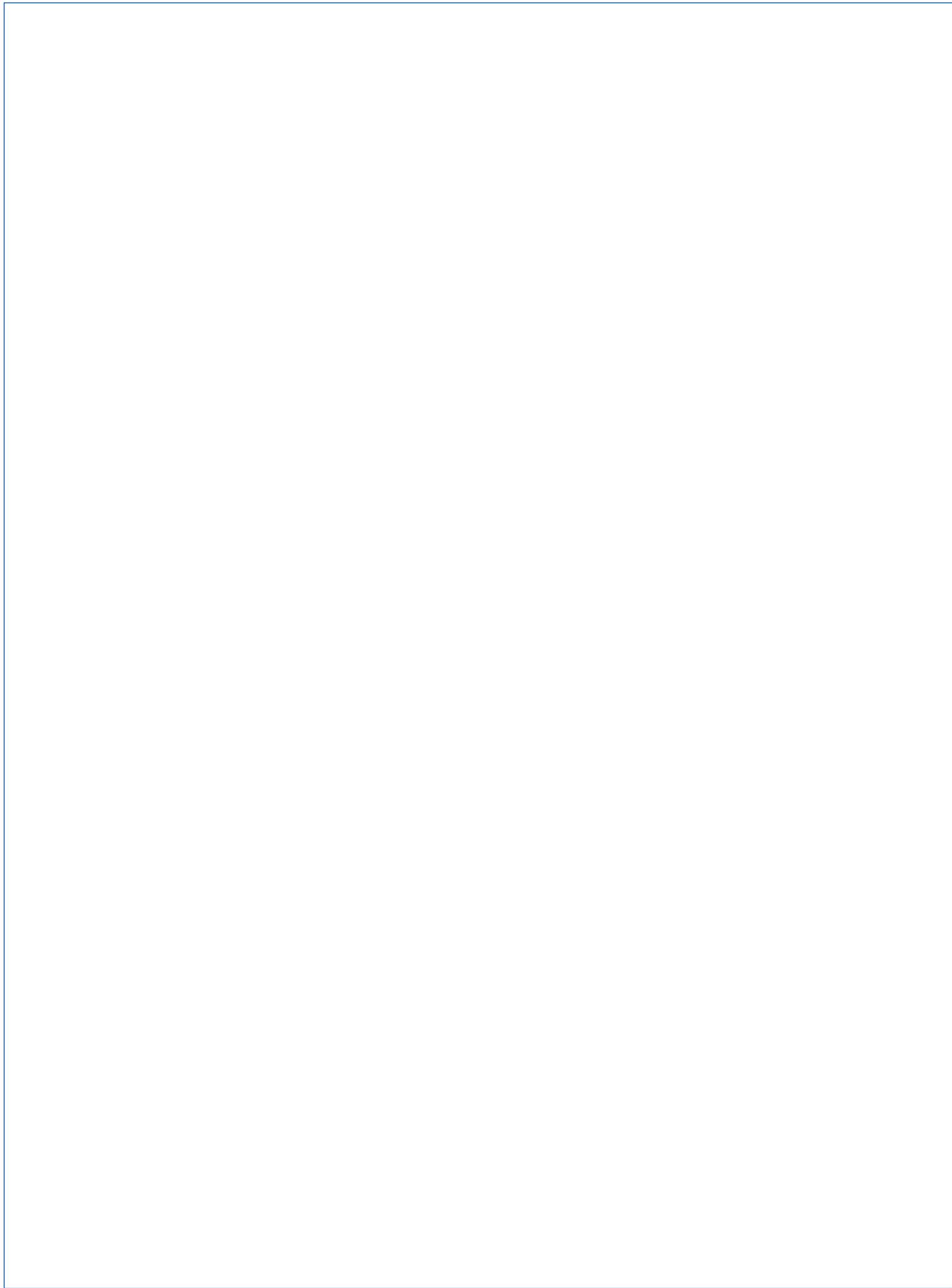

Who We Serve

(School Districts and Charter Schools)

As an intermediary educational agency, ESC Region 11 provides professional development, technical assistance, and management of educational programs to 76 public school districts, 16 public charter schools, 90 charter campuses, and 143 private schools. We serve a total of 582,106 total students and 77,183 educational personnel. With an area covering 10 counties in North Texas, Region 11 spans an area of 7,843 square miles, roughly equal to the state of Massachusetts in size. School districts in this region range in size from Fort Worth Independent School District's large metropolitan schools to small rural districts with only one building housing a total of 80 students in grades K-9.

During the session, attendees will learn from Deputy Superintendent Christopher McCammon, SWPrep Academy in San Antonio, how their Academic team utilized technology for tracking student information for their students impacted by the TEA requirements of HB4545. Through the technology, they were also able to track information for other programs related to ESSER interventionists they have placed at each campus, tutors for TCLAS, support staff for after-school programs focusing on interventions, ADSY summer programs through TCLAS, and several other Title 1 interventions. With the data easily gathered, the Academic Team can make decisions on the effectiveness at each campus and district-wide. The data tracked for students regarding HB4545 can easily be assessed and transferred to a different school in the event that a student transfers. Teachers and tutors can easily and quickly assess and communicate information for a large number of students at one time, allowing more time for the focus of teaching rather than paperwork while giving the district time to make decisions quickly with real-time data.

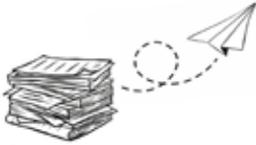

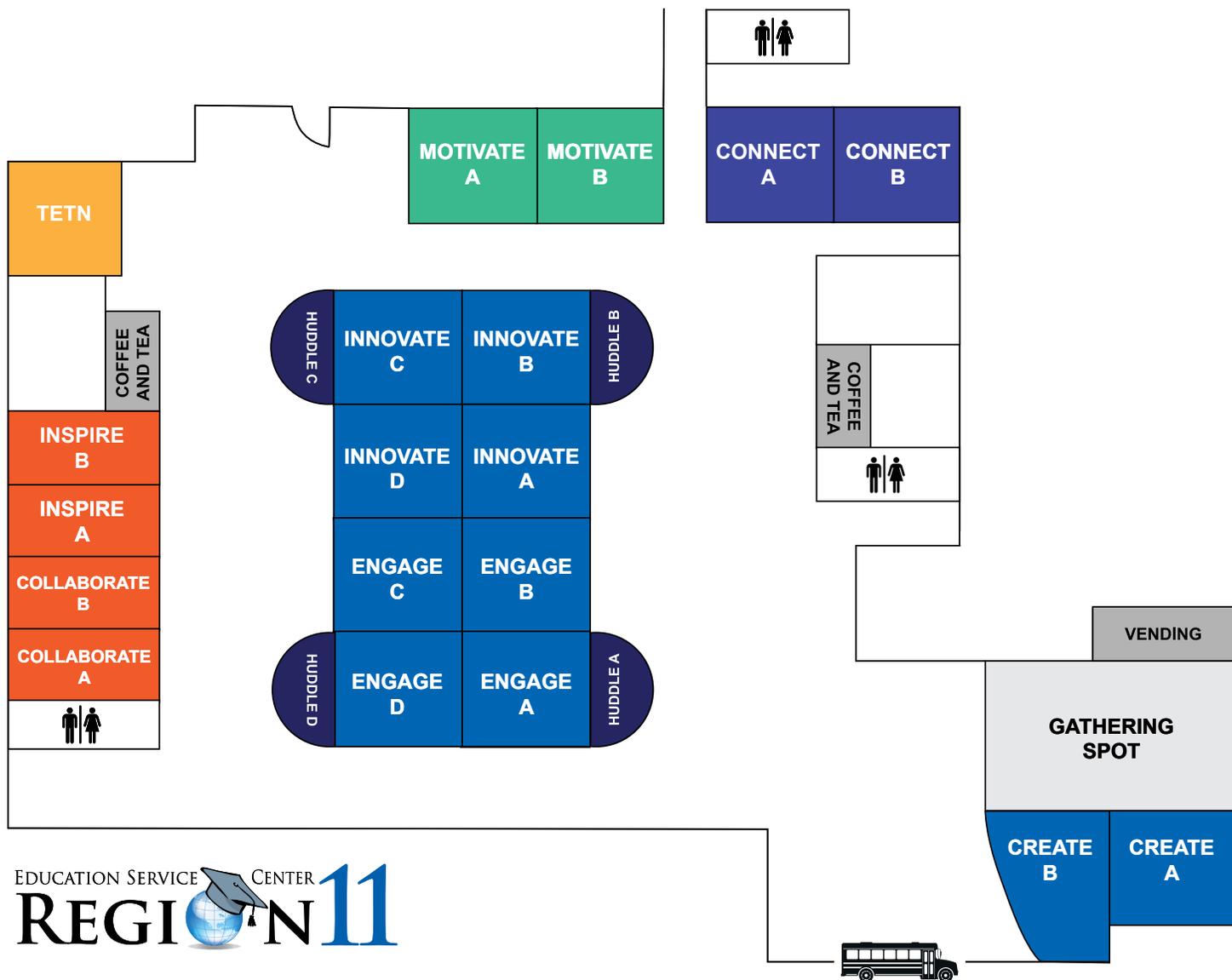
