New College & Career Exploration TEKS

At the April 2023 SBOE meeting, the board approved for second reading and final adoption proposed revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 127, Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Career Development and Career and Technical Education, Subchapter A, Middle School. The revisions will repeal two existing middle school college and career exploration courses, §127.2, Investigating Careers and §127.3, College and Career Readiness, and add a new middle school course, §127.2 Career and College Exploration.

Texas Education Code (TEC), §28.016, requires each school district to ensure that at least once in Grade 7 or 8 each student receives instruction in high school, college, and career preparation. The instruction must include information regarding the creation of a high school personal graduation plan, potential career choices, and the education needed to enter those careers. The new Career and College Exploration course provides an updated single course to provide instruction in high school, college, and career preparation that will be available for districts to use in meeting the requirements of TEC, §28.016. The SBOE, in approving the new Career and College Exploration course, authorized the course to be taken up to two times.

New College & Career Exploration TEKS

The recently adopted Career and College Exploration TEKS are scheduled for implementation **beginning with the 2023-2024** school year. Once the rules have been filed with the Texas Register, the TEKS will be available on the [Adopted State Board of Education Rules - Not Yet Effective webpage](#). The new TEKS become **effective on August 1, 2023**, and will be available in [19 Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 127, Subchapter A](#). **The existing courses will be repealed and no longer available beginning with the 2023-2024 school year.**

Proposed New TEKS: OSHA

Proposed New Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Occupational Safety and Health in 19 TAC Chapter 127, Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Career Development and Career and Technical Education, Subchapter B, High School

Summary: The proposed new sections would provide two options for Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills in workplace safety and health. One option would establish a one-credit standalone high school course and a second option would establish a set of standards to be imbedded within each career and technical education principles course. The SBOE is soliciting feedback on the two options to inform a final decision for its approach to occupational health and safety standards.

The SBOE will take registered oral and written comments on the proposal at the appropriate committee meeting in June 2023 in accordance with the SBOE board operating policies and procedures. 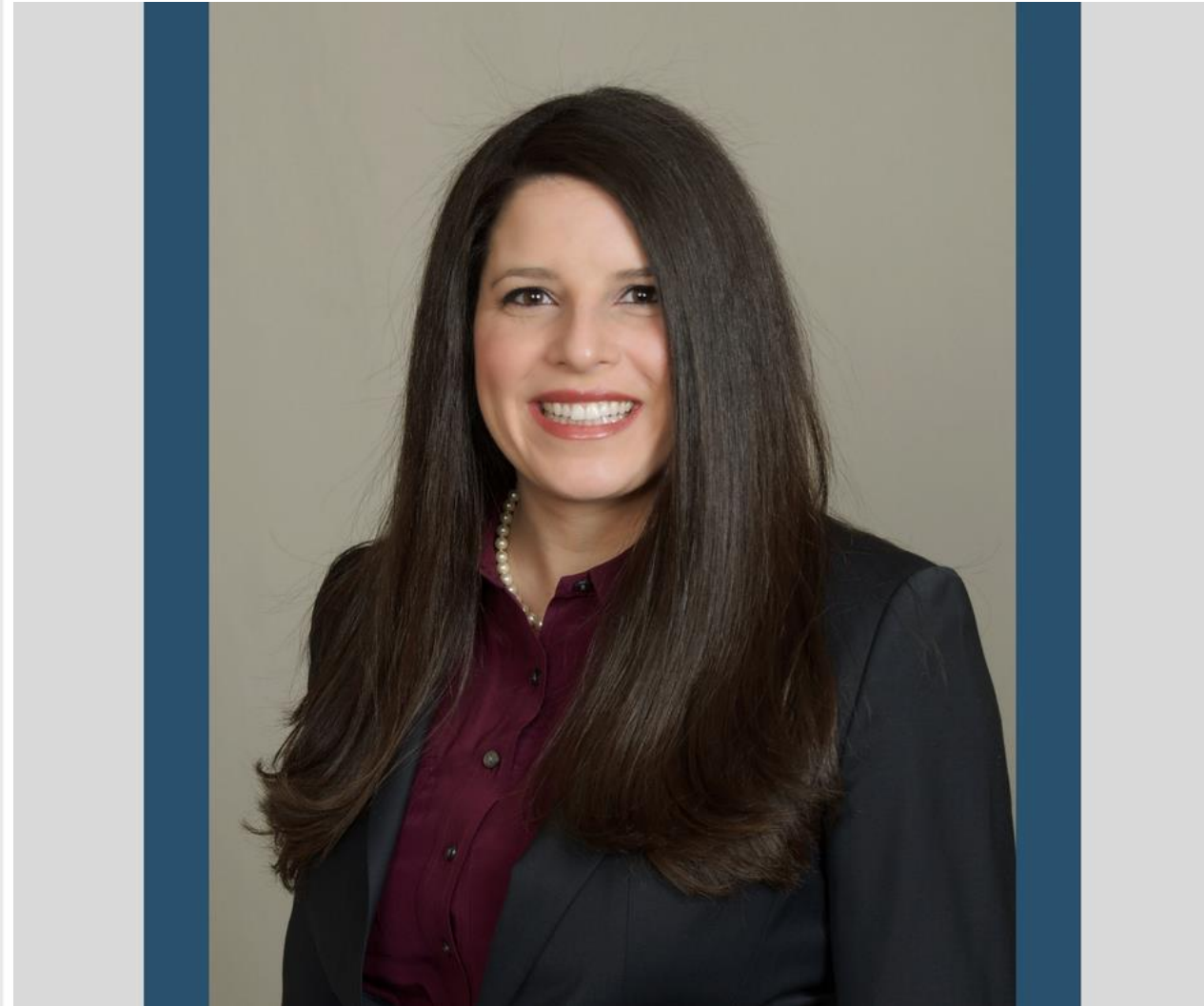

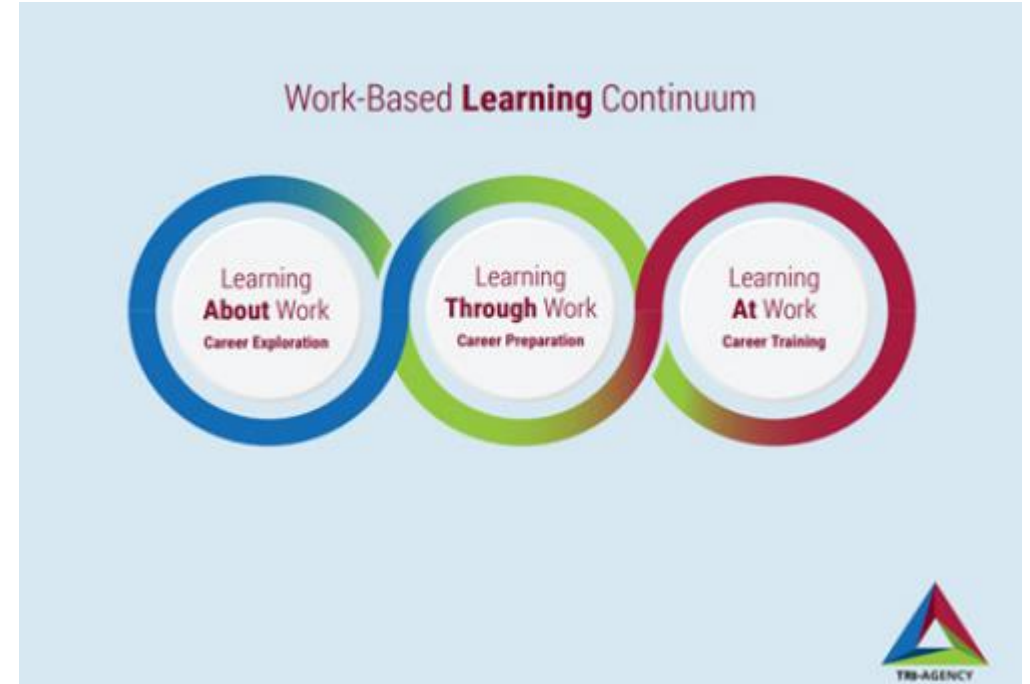

The CCMR Verifier provides districts an opportunity to verify the accuracy of their CCMR data and, if needed, submit official documentation to correct data. CCMR indicators determined by TSDS PEIMS submissions are not eligible for corrections, and therefore, will not be shown. The CCMR Verifier will contain data for 2021-22 annual graduates and non-graduating 12th graders.

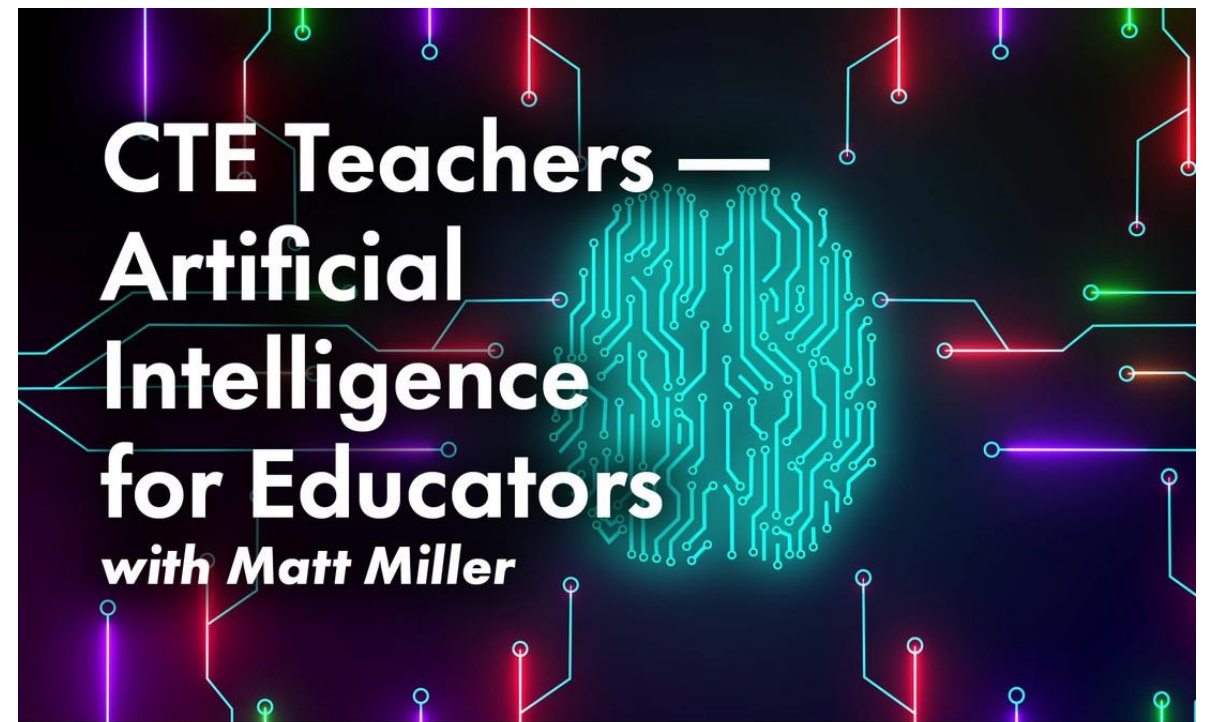




