New College & Career Exploration TEKS

At the April 2023 SBOE meeting, the board approved for second reading and final adoption proposed revisions to 19 TAC Chapter 127, Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Career Development and Career and Technical Education, Subchapter A, Middle School. The revisions will repeal two existing middle school college and career exploration courses, §127.2, Investigating Careers and §127.3, College and Career Readiness, and add a new middle school course, §127.2 Career and College Exploration.

Texas Education Code (TEC), §28.016, requires each school district to ensure that at least once in Grade 7 or 8 each student receives instruction in high school, college, and career preparation. The instruction must include information regarding the creation of a high school personal graduation plan, potential career choices, and the education needed to enter those careers. The new Career and College Exploration course provides an updated single course to provide instruction in high school, college, and career preparation that will be available for districts to use in meeting the requirements of TEC, §28.016. The SBOE, in approving the new Career and College Exploration course, authorized the course to be taken up to two times.



New College & Career Exploration TEKS

The recently adopted Career and College Exploration TEKS are scheduled for implementation beginning with the 2023-2024 school year. Once the rules have been filed with the Texas Register, the TEKS will be available on the Adopted State Board of Education Rules - Not Yet Effective webpage. The new TEKS become effective on August 1, 2023, and will be available in 19 Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 127, Subchapter A. The existing courses will be repealed and no longer available beginning with the 2023-2024 school year.

Summary: The proposed new sections would provide two options for Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills in workplace safety and health. One option would establish a onecredit standalone high school course and a second option would establish a set of standards to be imbedded within each career and technical education principles course. The SBOE is soliciting feedback on the two options to inform a final decision for its approach to occupational health and safety standards.

Public Comment Period: OSHA

Public Comment Period: May 12, 2023-5:00 p.m. on June 16, 2023. The SBOE will take registered oral and written comments on the proposal at the appropriate committee meeting in June 2023 in accordance with the SBOE board operating policies and procedures. 2023-2024 Planning Amounts Released

Planning amounts for LEAs for formula grants associated with the following are now available and can be viewed on the Entitlements webpage:

- Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)
- Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, Part B (IDEA-B) Formula (611) and Preschool (619)
- Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act (Perkins V)

Please note that these amounts are **estimates** and based on the latest available information, including US Department of Education (USDE) budget tables. For the grants associated with the 2023–2024 ESSA Consolidated Federal Grant Application, Revised Planning Amounts will be calculated in July/August 2023 when TEA receives its federal Grant Award Notifications (GANs) from USDE.

CCMR Tracker and Verifier

CCMR Verifier will be available in the <u>TEA Login (TEAL)</u> Accountability application from Thursday, May 24 to June 21. The CCMR Verifier provides districts an opportunity to verify the accuracy of their CCMR data and, if needed, submit official documentation to correct data. CCMR indicators determined by TSDS PEIMS submissions are not eligible for corrections, and therefore, will not be shown. The CCMR Verifier will contain data for 2021-22 annual graduates and non-graduating 12th graders.

Military Credit for Accountability

Where can I find information on how my campus will account for military enrollment for my 2023 graduates?

A TAA was sent on September 8, 2022 regarding a DD Form 4: <u>CCMR Credit for Military Enlistment</u>, <u>Beginning with 2023 Graduates | Texas Education Agency</u>.

The submission window for 2023 annual graduates will occur in spring 2024. Districts will submit the completed DD Form 4 via a secure upload process through the TEAL Accountability application. The process will be similar to the CCMR Verifier system.






