Strategic Plan

(Could be inclusive of the Board Plan)

Plans

School Board: 5 year plan - HB 3 now requires school boards to adopt three plans: 1) Early childhood literacy proficiency; 2) Early childhood math proficiency; and 3) College, career, and military readiness

Strategic Plan: 5 year plan - broad driver of the district

District Improvement Plan: 1 year plan - (driven by the Strategic Plan and Needs Assessment) (Required by TEC 11.252).

*LEA Plan: ESSA required (annual) plan (for those receiving Title funds) with 13 descriptors that could be embedded/addressed in the DIP or could be added as an addendum to the DIP.

Campus Improvement Plan (TEC)/Schoolwide Plan (ESSA): 1 year plan (driven by the District Improvement Plan and Needs Assessment of the Campus – they should be mutually supportive)


(*ESSA references this plan as a Schoolwide Plan *TEC references this plan as the Campus Improvement Plan)

Then there are plans for campuses that don't meet accountability: **Targeted Improvement Plan (TIP)** and possibly a **Turnaround Plan (TAP)** that included additional consideration and focus of the Effective Schools Framework (ESF) and should correlate to the CIP.









To ensure that all children receive a high-quality education, and to close the achievement gap between children meeting the challenging State academic standards and those children who are not meeting such standards, the LEA plan shall include the following 13 descriptions.







Description 1:

How the LEA will monitor students' progress in meeting the challenging State academic standards by [Section 1112(b)(1)]—

- 1. Developing and implementing a well-rounded program of instruction to meet the academic needs of all students;
- 2. Identifying students who may be at risk for academic failure;
- 3. Providing additional educational assistance to individual students the LEA or school determines need help in meeting the challenging State academic standards; and
- 4. Identifying and implementing instructional and other strategies intended to strengthen academic programs and improve school conditions for student learning.


Homeless LEA Reservation



- The Title I, Part A LEA Program Plan can be embedded in the District Improvement Plan.








